**Course Title: English for Research Article Publication Purposes** 



## A. Introduction:

This course aims to equip the medical researchers with the basic understanding of academic research article genre and the key principles they need to follow for developing different sections of an English medical research article.

## **B.** Course objectives:

- To guide the researchers through a set of step-by-step procedures for writing research articles in English.
- To develop the researchers' knowledge of the generic structure of different sections of research articles, i.e. abstract, introduction, results, discussion, and conclusion.
- To familiarize the researchers with the common lexical and grammatical properties (linguistic features) required for writing a research article.
